An Observation on the Correlation between  
Standardized Birth-, Death- and Natural  
Increase Rate and Some Indices concerning  
Characteristics of Cities, 1935.

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## I. Purpose:

Chief characteristics of natural increase of population in cities is researched in a separate paper X 1), and our next problem is to clarify the causes of this natural increase. The first step is to find out the statistical relations between the indices concerning characteristics of cities and fertility.

## II. Method:

The following points are considered as chief indices concerning characteristics of cities.

- (1) Population (Scales of cities considered from population.)
- (2) Density (Degree of city population density)
- (3) Industrial population rate (Degree of city industrialization)
- (4) Agricultural character)
- (5) Rate of the population born in other prefectures (Degree of city "colonization")

Those indices are shown in the supplement table.

Concerning indices (1)-(5) respectively, the correlation coefficients between Standardized Birth Rates and them, has been calculated.

But cities whose population is over 50,000 are picked up here, excepting cities in Hokkaido that have special characteristics as cities possessing a colonial character, and cities in Okinawa prefecture whose special nature is great.

### III. Results:

The results are as following table

Seeing the table, the correlation, though of a low degree, can be found concerning the agricultural population rate and the rate of the population born in other prefectures.

### IV. Conclusions:

Generally the fertility which decides the natural increase of city population shows the low tendency comparatively in cities of large population and high density. But, concerning individual towns, (1) population and (2) density, respectively, have no correlation between the fertility. Accordingly it is surmised that the causes which determine the fertility of cities are no so much formal, quantitative characteristics of cities, as qualitative differences of cities. As to (3), the correlation can not be found. But, as to (4) and (5), the correlation can be found. It is considered to suggest that this fact is due to the sociological nature of cities, or to the "gemeinschaftlich" character of cities.
