§ Explanation of the Survey

♦ What is the National Survey on Marriage and Childbearing (Japanese National Fertility Survey)?

This survey is a nationwide sample survey conducted approximately every five years to study marriage, childbirth, and child-rearing among the population. This is the 17th iteration. There are two types of questionnaires: one for married couples and one for single individuals.

♦ Purpose of the Survey

National and local governments must understand the circumstances and issues faced by residents when implementing various policies. The primary purpose of this survey is to grasp the situation regarding marriage, childbirth, and child-rearing among the population and to explore related policy challenges from a social science perspective. Particularly in Japan today, the declining birthrate is progressing, and it is pointed out that the associated population decrease, aging population, and changes in individual lifestyles will significantly impact Japanese society's future. Understanding the current state of this declining birthrate and investigating its causes is one of the crucial objectives of this survey.

♦ Scope of the Survey

This survey is intended for individuals residing in randomly selected areas nationwide. Separate questionnaires are prepared for the following two groups:

[Questionnaire for Married Persons]


All women under the age of 55 who are married as of June 30, regardless of whether the marriage has been officially registered, are eligible.

[Questionnaire for Single Persons]

All single persons (both male and female) aged 18 or over and under 55 as of June 30 are eligible.

♦ Survey Structure

This survey is conducted by the National Institute of Population and Social Security Research (a national research institute affiliated with the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare), with approval from the Minister for Internal Affairs and Communications based on the Statistics Act, in cooperation with the national government, prefectures (or designated cities, core cities, cities with public health centers, special wards), and local public health centers. The survey is carried out by survey staffs appointed by the Governor (Mayor/Ward Mayor) who will visit your residence to distribute the questionnaire and related materials, facilitating online responses or collecting the completed questionnaires (sealed in envelopes).



Protection of Privacy and Personal Information

All answers on this questionnaire will be used solely for the purpose of creating statistics. Any other use is strictly prohibited by the Statistics Act. Questionnaires completed by participants and sealed in the return envelopes will be delivered to the National Institute of Population and Social Security Research without being opened after collection by the staff, and will subsequently be kept under strict control. All personally identifiable information will be removed during the process of creating statistics. Therefore, there is absolutely no possibility of personal information being leaked.

- ◆ In the National Survey on Marriage and Childbearing (Japanese National Fertility Survey), personal information is strictly protected according to the provisions of the Statistics Act.
