### 2-5 Social security schemes included in Receipts of Social Security Schemes (EU standards)

Receipts of Social Security Schemes (EU standards) include receipts of the schemes listed in Appendix 2-1. However, receipts of the following schemes are excluded as they do not provide direct benefits to households:

- A portion of aid to employers under employment insurance, employment measures, and other schemes (programs undertaken by the Japan Organization for Employment of the Elderly, Persons with Disabilities and Job Seekers)<sup>1</sup>
- Promotion costs, aid to training of medical and nursing professionals, etc., under schemes related to public health and social welfare.

The following scheme is are not included in Social Expenditure (OECD standards) and Social Benefits and Social Security Revenue (ILO standards), but included in Receipts of Social Security Schemes (EU standards):

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Employment adjustment aid under employment insurance schemes, which is provided to subsidize costs that are ultimately paid to employees such as leave allowance, are included, but any other aid to employers is not included (it is excluded from employers' social contributions by estimation). Specifically, the relevant amount is estimated by multiplying the amount of employer contributions under employment insurance by the percentage attributable to the employment maintenance program and the vocational skills development program and the percentage of costs that should be excluded under the EU standards in these programs. Among programs undertaken by the Japan Organization for Employment of the Elderly, Persons with Disabilities and Job Seekers, the persons with disabilities employment levy scheme is excluded as it is not ultimately paid to employees.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Under the EU standards, private pension funds formed for each occupational field or labor union that invest contributions in accordance with the provisions of law or agreements made between employees and employers are included, provided that the employer assumes the investment risk. As for relevant schemes in Japan, Defined Benefit Corporate Pension falls under the category mentioned above. However, Defined Contribution Pension (either corporate-type or individual-type) is excluded because under this scheme, plan participants decide where to invest and personally assume their investment risk.
